SMSes to help parents remember children's vaccination dates

MUMBAI: Nine out of 10 parents in India do not follow the vaccination schedules of their children, leading to high incidence of infants dropping out of the vaccination programme, said doctors from the Indian Academy of Pediatrics (IAP), one of the largest bodies of pediatricians in the country.

To increase immunisation adherence, IAP has developed a free-of-cost SMS vaccine reminder service that was launched nationwide in 2014.

In two years, the service has already found over one million users, from both urban and rural parts of the country.

"Most parents do not maintain vaccination calendars and often forget to vaccinate their child on time. Parents take vaccinations very seriously in the initial years, soon after they lose track," said Dr Pramod Jog, national president, IAP.

According to Dr Jog, around 50% of children below the age of two did not receive timely vaccinations, in 2014-15.

Doctors said that several international studies have proven that regular reminders improve vaccination rates by around 20% and this prompted them to initiate the service in India.

From the time of birth till the child is 12, 11 reminders are sent for vaccinations against 16 diseases, including the DBT vaccine for diphtheria, pertussis and tetanus, IPV vaccine for polio and MMR vaccine for measles.

The service gets activated on the phones as soon as parents register their child with IAP by messaging the child's name and age to the IAP's phone number code. The doctors, who conceived

Most parents don't maintain vaccination calendar

MUMBAI: Most parents in the country still do not maintain a vaccination immunisation calendar, and miss out on vaccine doses for their children, said doctors associated with the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) on Thursday.

Speaking to mediapersons, Dr Pramod Jog, president of IAP, said that every year, vaccine preventable diseases account for over 1.5 million deaths and about 1 million disabilities in children under 5 years of age in India. "In India, the percentage of children between 12-23 months of age who received all recommended vaccines on time is just 51.6% as parents do not

fault is observed in both urban and rural areas," said Dr Jog.

Doctors emphasised that it is important to administer vaccinations for the top life-threatening vaccine preventable diseases in India such as pneumonia, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, rotavirus, polio, tuberculosis, measles and hepatitis B.

It was close this immunisation gap that Immunize India Charity launched a vaccine reminder program in associ-

ation with IAP in 2014.

IAP-Immunize India is a free-of-cost SMS based vaccination reminder service which is nationally available across all mobile networks in India. Since almost every adult in urban and rural areas have mobile phones, the SMS reminder service is the most cost-effective reminder that a vaccination is due.

Doctors at the conference said Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and Kalyan have recorded 1.12 lakh registrations.

Dr Jog said that many infants were missing out regular vaccinations and these lapses are responsible for increased rates of child morbidity and mortality in India which can definitely be avoided.

For your baby's injectable polio vaccine, you must go to BMC health centres

The vaccine is not available on the market, or with private doctors; it must be injected at the same time as the oral vaccine

Unlike the oral polio vaccine that the civic body gave for free to private practitioners, the injectable polio vaccine, introduced by the BMC on Tuesday, will be available only in public health-care facilities. There is no stock of the vaccine in the market for doctors in private practice to buy. Both the BMC and paediatricians are asking parents to take their children to public units for their shot.

The BMC started administering the injectable vaccine on Tuesday. The vaccine, which now figures in the immunisation calendar, has to be administered to children at the age of six weeks and then 14 weeks, along with the oral polio vaccine.

Paediatricians say they do not wish to confuse parents and hence giving out uniform advice: take your child to a civic-run facility for the injectable vaccine.

BETTER MEDICINE vaccine

Dr Uday Pai, consultant paediatrician and past president of the Indian Academy of Paediatrics, said, "We have told all our members to refer children to municipal centres for the vaccine dose. We have also sent a letter to the BMC that if private patients do come, they too should be given the vaccine."

Doctors said parents should not panic, nor get confused. "If a child misses a shot, a catch up shot can be given later. This is not an emergency vaccine," said Dr Pai.

Civic officials said they have adequate supply of the vaccine. Dr Padmaja Keskar, BMC's executive health officer, said: "All private doctors can send us children for the injectable vaccine. We will be giving it for free."

launched the injectable vaccine, the government had procured all the stock available with various vaccine dealerships. Paediatricians who were giving the injectable vaccine earlier, said they haven't given a single shot since January as there were no vaccines available in the market.

"Until last August or September, a monthly stock of 15,000 to 20,000 doses of the injectable vaccine was enough for Mumbai," said vaccine dealer Dr Harish Shah. "But awareness shot

up after the government started advertising on television that it would start administering injectable polio vaccine from April, 2016. So the demand shot up after that," Dr Shah, adding that there has been no stock for the last three months.

The shortage of the injectable polio vaccine is a global phenomenon. That is why it is being administered as an intradermal injection — between the layers of the skin — and not as an intramuscular injection, which uses up a larger quantity. The intramuscular shot needs just one dose, while the intradermal injection is given twice.

Both doctors and government officials are hopeful that production of the vaccine will scale up in the months to come.

100% protection from polio

Officials of the public health department have said that "simultaneous immunisation by oral polio vaccine and injectable polio vaccine will give dual protection to children and the community" and that "it will prevent reinfection and reactivation of polio disease". Doctors too said that the two doses of the injectable polio will be 100 per cent protection from the virus.

"To eradicate polio completely, extra doses of oral polio vaccine are to be administered to children under five during every pulse polio campaign in addition to the oral and injectable polio vaccine doses," the BMC stated in a press release following the injectable vaccine's launch.

NOW, SMS ALERTS TO REMIND PARENTS TO VACCINATE KIDS

With a view to achieving full immunisation across the country, the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) has launched SMS alerts to remind parents to vaccinate their children on particular dates. Designed at the national level, SMS alerts will be sent for free without any registration charges.

Messages will be sent to parents till their children reach 12 years. To avail the service, parents have to first register themselves with IAP database by sending an SMS to 566778, conveying the baby's name and date of birth. They will receive an immediate confirmation text message. Three reminders will be sent on the registered number two days before the due date of vaccination.

To commemorate World Immunisation Week (April 24-30), IAP organised a programme titled "Close the Immunisation

Gap" in Mumbai on Thursday. Speaking at the programme, medical experts said that only 51.6 per cent of Indian children below two years of age receive timely recommended vaccinations across the country. Further, over 1.5 million deaths are recorded annually, which can be stopped through proper vaccination.

Dr Pramod Jog, National IAP President, said, "In India, the percentage of children between 12 and 23 months of age who receive all recommended vaccines on time is very low. A major reason is that parents do not maintain a vaccination calendar and often forget to vaccinate their children on time in a disciplined manner. This default is observed in both urban and rural areas."

IAP launches SMS alert system for child vaccinations

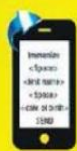
The Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) organisation, along with medical professionals and paediatricians, has launched its SMS alert services in order to remind parents to vaccinate their children on a particular date. The SMS alert will be sent for free on cell-phones, this is a nationwide alert service that was introduced on Thursday.

The IAP has free vaccination reminder service that will cover a child from birth till 12 years of age. To avail the service, parents have to first register themselves with a IAP database by sending an SMS to 566778 conveying the baby's name and date of birth. They will receive an immediate confirmation and text messages for 12 years. There will be three reminders at two day intervals for each vaccination due.

Till now only 51.6% of Indian children below 2 years receives timely recommended vaccinations across the country. Annually, vaccine preventable diseases account for over 1.5 million deaths and about 1 million disabilities in children below 5 years in India. It is important to administer vaccinations for the top life-threatening vaccine preventable diseases in India such as Pneumonia, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, rotavirus, polio, tuberculosis, measles and hepatitis B.

While interacting with ADC, Dr. Pramod Jog, National IAP President said, "In India, the percentage of children between 12-23 months of age who receive all the recommended vaccines on time is very low. A major reason is

Now, get injectable polio vaccines at BMC clinics

Mumbai: The final battle to eradicate the crippling polio virus began on Tuesday with the BMC offering injectable polio vaccines. Each of the nearly 1.75 lakh children born in the city annually needs to be given two injectable polio vaccine (IPV) shots, apart from five doses of the oral polio vaccine (OPV).

However, due to a global shortage of IPVs, the state has asked for the injection to be given intradermally (between skin's layers) and not into the muscles. "We can vaccinate 50 children intradermally with a 5ml vial instead of just 10 using the muscular route," said a state official.

The Indian Academy of Pediatrics says the intramuscular route is better; but the BMC said the World Health Organization allows both. "We can achieve the same immunity levels with a smaller dose given intradermal-

ly," said BMC executive health officer Dr Padmaja Keskar.

The IPV shots will be given on the right upper arm so that health officials can later tell if a child has been vaccinated by just looking. "The IPV shots will be at six and 14 weeks of age at any of the BMC's centres," said Dr Keskar. Only BMC has IPV supplies and it won't be distributed to the private sector. "Every child brought to our clinics will get vaccinated," she added.

India was declared polio-free three years ago, but cases continue in Pakistan and Afghanistan. "OPV gives immunity to the community while the IPV boosts an individual's immunity," said BMC's Dr Mangala Gomare about the "dual protection mechanism". From Tuesday, the oral vaccine too has changed. IAP secretary general Dr Bakul Parekh said the OPV doses will only target type 1 and 3 polio viruses and not contain type 2.

THE INDIAN Academy of Pediatrics (IAP) and Immunize India Charity, on the occasion of World Immunization Week (April 24-30), have come together to discuss challenges and solutions to 'Close the Immunization Gap' in accordance with the 2016 WHO theme.

They also highlighted milestones achieved by their joint programme 'IAP-Immunize India', making it the largest national healthcare initiative of its kind to increase immunisation adherence and coverage across the country.

India's immunisation coverage compared to its developed neighbours is very low.

Annually, vaccine-preventable diseases account for over 1.5 million deaths and about a million disabilities in children below five years in India.

Commenting on the concerns of low immunisation rate in India, Dr Pramod Jog, National IAP President and Consultant Pediatrician, said, "In India, the percentage of children between 12-23 months of age who received all recommended vaccines on time is just 51.6 per cent."

A major reason is that parents do not maintain a vaccination calendar and often forget to vaccinate the child on time in a disciplined manner.

This is observed both in urban and rural areas.

Total, 14 per cent infants who come in contact with immunisation services to receive

their Bacillus Calmette-Guérin (BCG) vaccine do not receive their measles vaccine scheduled at the ninth month.

Many children below five years do not receive regular pneumococcal vaccines.

These lapses are responsible for increased rates of child morbidity and mortality in India which can definitely be avoided, Jog added.

Prompted by distressed parents' dilemma of delayed or missed immunisation for their children, the Immunize India Charity conceived the vaccine reminder programme and partnered with IAP to launch 'IAP Immunize India' in March 2014.

IAP Immunize India is a free SMS-based vaccination reminder service which is nationally available across all mobile

networks in India.

The Maharashtra Telecom Circle (including Pune and Goa but excluding Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and Kalyan) recorded 1,18,301 registrations at IAP Immunize India.

Dr Ranjan Kumar Pejaver, Founder and Principal Trustee, Immunize India Charity, said, "As of March 31, 2016, the IAP Immunize India has received more than a million registrations (10,06,000) across India which has contributed greatly to increased compliance."

"An additional 3,00,000 vaccinations are happening which would have normally been missed," Pejaver said, adding that, now, the University of Kentucky, USA has approached them to implement a pilot programme on this issue.

40k kids enroll for vaccine reminders

IAP is sending SMS alerts in bid to promote immunisation

With a view to promote immunisations programme and reduce deaths caused by vaccine-preventable diseases, the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) has started with SMS reminder service for vaccination. Around 40,000 kids from across the state have enrolled for the service known as, 'IAP Immunisation India Vaccine Reminder SMS Service'.

According to data provided by IAP officials, around 12,000 kids have received timely vaccines due to this programme. City-based paediatrician, Dr Raju Shah, who was responsible for its implementation in the city, was awarded by Ericsson and CNN-IBN in the category of

'Best Innovations 2015'. Talking about how the service works, Dr Shah said, "Three reminders are sent on the parent's cell phone. The first message is sent before a week, the second on the date of vaccination and the third after the date has passed. This service is not only helpful in providing timely vaccination to children but also in bringing down the children mortality rate."

Shah claims that diseases such as pneumonia and diarrhoea are triggered by infections which can be easily cured with vaccination. "Illiteracy and lack of awareness about timely vaccination are the major reasons for children failing to get vaccinated," added Shah.

मोहीम सुरू केली. पिंपरी येथील डी. वाय पाटील वैद्यकीय महाविद्यालयात डॉ. जोग प्राध्यापक असून, पुणे पालक शिक्षक संघाचे अध्यक्ष आहेत. संघटनेच्या लसीकरण विषयक सल्लागार समितीचे ते अध्यक्ष आहेत.



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लसीकरणाचे शिक्षण हवे



एका महिन्यापासून ते पाच वर्षांपर्यंतच्या बालकाचा विविध आजारांपासून बचाव करण्यासाठी लसीकरण केले जाते. मात्र त्याबाबत पालकांमध्ये जागृती नसल्याने आता लसीकरण वाढविण्यासाठी आरोग्य शिक्षण देण्याची गरज व्यक्त करण्यात आली. सध्या जगभर जागतिक लसीकरण सप्ताह पाळण्यात येत आहे. या निमित्ताने अखिल भारतीय बालरोग तज्ज्ञ संघटनेचे अध्यक्ष डॉ. प्रमोद जोग यांच्याशी आमचे प्रतिनिधी मुस्तफा आतार यांनी साधलेला हा संवाद.....

जागतिक लसीकरणाच्या सप्ताहाचे नेमके महत्त्व काय?

जगात विविध आजारांपासून बालकांना वाचविण्यासाठी प्रतिबंधक लसीकरण सुरू आहे. परंतु, अपेक्षेएवढे लसीकरण होत नाही. लसीकरणामध्ये मोठा गॅप आहे. त्यात अनेक त्रुटी असल्याचे आढळते. सर्व बालकांचे लसीकरण करायचे असेल, तर त्यासाठी प्रयत्न करण्याची आवश्यकता आहे. लसीकरणाचे प्रमाण वाढविण्यासाठी जनजागृती करण्यासाठी जागतिक लसीकरण सप्ताह पाळण्यात येतो. सध्या जगात पोलिओ, टिपल, गोवरच्या लसी पहिल्या वर्षी दिल्या जातात. भारतात क्षयरोगाला प्रतिबंध करण्यासाठी बीसीजी ही लस दिली जाते. त्याशिवाय घटसर्प, धनुर्वात, डांग्या खोकला अशी त्रिगुणी (ट्रीपल) तसेच गोवर प्रतिबंधक लसीचा समावेश आहे. न्यूमोनिया आणि रोंटाव्हायरसमुळे होणारे जुलाब या लसींचा राष्ट्रीय कार्यक्रमांतर्गत समावेश होऊ लागला आहे.

लसीकरणाचे प्रमाण कमी आहे. त्यामध्ये नेमका कोणता अडथळा येतो?

हो. लसीकरणाचे प्रमाण कमी आहे. कोणत्या दिवशी अथवा महिन्यात कोणत्या आजाराची लस द्यावी या वेळापत्रकाची अनेकदा पालकांना माहिती नसते. तसेच पालक लसीकरण करायचे विसरून

जातात. पालकांना लसीकरण फारसे आवडत नाही. लसीच्या किमती अधिक असल्यानेही त्या देण्यास टाळाटाळ केली जाते. त्याशिवाय लसीकरणाबाबत काही समाजात अंधश्रद्धा आहे. त्यामुळे लसीकरण होण्यामध्ये अडथळे निर्माण होत आहेत. आता सरकारने सर्व लसी मोफत करण्याचा निर्णय घेतला आहे.

लसीकरणाच्या धोरणाबाबत काय सांगाल?

जुलाब होणाऱ्या जंतुविरोधात रोंटाव्हायरस तसेच न्यूमोनियावरील लसी देण्याचे धोरण आखण्यात आले आहे. या लसी सुरू करण्यासाठी अखिल भारतीय बालरोग संघटनेने सातत्याने प्रयत्न केले आहेत. त्यामुळे त्या लसी सुरू झाल्या आहेत. घटसर्प, डांग्या खोकला, धनुर्वातासारखे आजार घातक आहेत. पोलिओचा त्यात समावेश होता. पोलिओ

आटोक्यात आल्याने गोवर, रोंटाव्हायरस, न्यूमोनिया या आजारांवर लसीकरणासाठी लक्ष केंद्रित केले आहे.

लसीकरणापुढील आव्हाने कोणती?

देशात लसीकरण १०० टक्के पूर्ण होत नाही. वेळापत्रकानुसार आठवण करणारा मेसेज देण्याचा प्रकल्प अखिल भारतीय बालरोग तज्ज्ञांच्या संघटनेने राबविण्यास सुरुवात केली आहे. लसीकरण केल्याने कोणताही धोका नाही. तसेच दुर्बल, भटक्या विमुक्त जाती जमाती वर्गात लसीकरण करण्याचे राहून जाते. त्या वर्गांमध्ये याबाबत जनजागृती करण्याची गरज आहे. शहरासह ग्रामीण भागात लसीकरण करण्यासाठी टाळाटाळ केली जाते. लसीकरण किंवा मुलांच्या आरोग्याकडे प्राधान्याने लक्ष दिले जात नाही. त्या करिता 'इम्युनाइज इंडिया' प्रकल्पाद्वारे पालकांना मेसेज पाठवून लसीकरणाचा 'रिमाइंडर' देतो. बिहार, राजस्थान, मध्य प्रदेशात लसीकरणाची भयावह स्थिती आहे. त्या ठिकाणी लसीकरणाबाबत अज्ञान आहे. एकूणच लसीकरणाबाबत पालकांसह समाजातही आरोग्य शिक्षण दिले पाहिजे. हेच लसीकरणापुढील मोठे आव्हान आहे.

लहान मुलांच्या आरोग्याबाबत अखिल भारतीय बालरोग संघटना कोणते प्रयत्न करीत आहे?

लहान मुलांच्या आरोग्याबाबत बालरोग तज्ज्ञ संघटनेने विविध कार्यक्रम हाती घेतले आहेत. बाळाच्या जन्माच्यावेळी आईला स्तनपानाचे महत्त्व पटवून देण्यासाठी आयुष्याची 'आदर्श सुरुवात' असा दहा सूत्री कार्यक्रम हाती घेतला आहे. बाळाच्या जन्मानंतर अर्धा तासात स्तनपान करणे, जंतुसंसर्गापासून दूर राहण्यासाठी हात स्वच्छ धुणे याबाबत प्रबोधन सुरू आहे. पाळण्यापासून ते हातात खडू धरेपर्यंत मुलांचा विकास कसा होतो, लसीकरण आणि संसर्गजन्य आजार प्रशिक्षण परिवर्तन अशा विविध मुद्द्यांवर संघटना आता वर्षभर काम करीत आहे.

पुणे : एका वर्षाच्या आतील बालकांना आवश्यक असलेल्या लसींची पालकांना आठवण करून देण्यासाठी देशात 'इम्युनाइज इंडिया' प्रकल्प राबविण्यात येत आहे. बालकाला लसीकरण कधी करायचे याचा मेसेज प्रत्येक महिलेच्या मोबाइलवर दिला जात असून त्यामुळे लसीकरणाच्या प्रमाणात २० टक्क्यांनी वाढ झाली आहे.

महाराष्ट्रासह विविध राज्यांत हा प्रकल्प राबविला जात आहे. प्रकल्पांतर्गत देशातील दहा लाख महिलांची नोंदणी नव्याने करण्यात आली, तर २०२० पर्यंत तीन कोटी बालकांची नोंदणी करण्याचा मानस आहे; तसेच एक लाख ३० हजार



बालकांना अपंग होण्यापासून तसेच मृत्यू होण्यापासूनही वाचविण्याचे उद्देश आहे. मेसेज कसा पाठवाल?

या प्रकल्पांतर्गत पालकांनी मोबाइल क्रमांकावर बाळाचे टोपण नाव (निक नेम), जन्मतारीख लिहून हा संदेश ५६६७७८ या क्रमांकावर पाठवायचा आहे. बालकाच्या जन्मतारखेनुसार सोमवार, बुधवार आणि शुक्रवार या तीन दिवशी पालकांच्या मोबाइलवर 'रिमाइंडर मेसेज' येतो. त्यानुसार पालकांनी नजीकच्या डॉक्टरांकडे जाऊन कोणत्या दिवशी लस घ्यायची यानुसार लसीकरण करणे अपेक्षित आहे.

'इम्युनाइज इंडिया' प्रकल्प हाती घेतला आहे. देशातील दहा लाख मुलांची त्यात नोंदणी झाली आहे. प्रकल्पांमुळे देशात लसीकरणाचे प्रमाण २० टक्क्यांनी वाढले, अशी माहिती भारतीय बालरोग तज्ज्ञ संघटनेचे राष्ट्रीय अध्यक्ष डॉ. प्रमोद जोग यांनी 'मटा'ला दिली.

प्रकल्पांतर्गत महाराष्ट्रातून एक लाख १८ हजार बालकांची नव्याने नोंद झाली. देशातील साडेचार हजारांहून अधिक बालकांचे अपंगत्वापासून तसेच मृत्यूपासून संरक्षण करणे शक्य झाले. 'रिमाइंडर मेसेज' पाठविण्यामुळे ग्रामीण भागातील महिलांमध्ये जागृती वाढली आहे. महाराष्ट्रात २० हजार बालकांना त्याचा फायदा झाल्याचे सिद्ध झाले आहे. देशातील हा सर्वाधिक मोठा उपक्रम मानला जात आहे, असेही डॉ. जोग यांनी सांगितले.

प्रकल्प साकारण्यासाठी सध्या देशात एका मोबाइल कंपनीशी करार केला आहे. त्याच कंपनीच्या फोनधारकांना 'रिमाइंडर मेसेज'ची सेवा देणे शक्य आहे. लसीकरणासाठी अन्य मोबाइल कंपन्यांशी करार करण्याचा संघटनेचा प्रयत्न सुरू आहे. अन्य कंपन्या या प्रकल्पात सहभागी झाल्यास लसीकरण वाढण्यास मदत होईल.

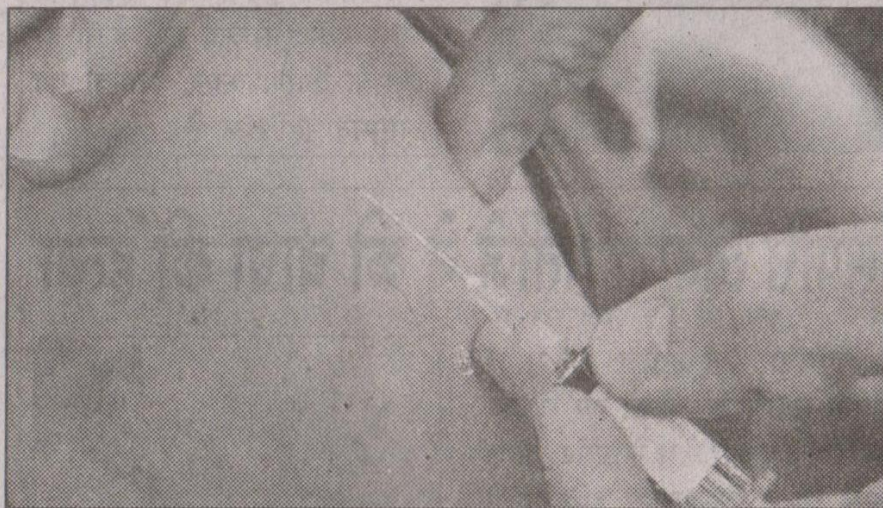

उल्लेखनीय है कि निमोनिया, डिप्थीरिया, टिटनेस, काली खांसी, रोगावायरस, पोलियो, टीबी, खसरा और हेपेटाइटिस बी जैसे रोगों के लिए टीकाकरण बहुत महत्वपूर्ण है।

ટકાવારી ફક્ત ૫૧.૬ ટકા છે. આનું મુખ્ય કારણ વાલીઓ રસી આપવાની તારીખોનું પાલન કરતા નથી અને મોટે ભાગે શિસ્તબદ્ધ રીતે બાળકને રસી અપાવવાનું ભૂલી જાય છે. આ કસૂર શહેર અને ગ્રામીણ વિસ્તારોમાં પણ જેવા મળે છે. બીસીજી રસી પ્રાપ્ત કરવા માટે રસીકરણ સેવાઓ સાથે સંપર્કમાં આવતા ૧૪ ટકા બાળકોને નિર્ધારિત ૮મા મહિને તેમની અછબડાની રસી પ્રાપ્ત થતી નથી. ૫ વર્ષથી ઓછી ઉંમરના ઘણા બધા બાળકોને નિયમિત રીતે ન્યુમોકોક્કલ રસી પ્રાપ્ત થતી નથી. આ કસૂરને લીધે ભારતમાં બાળકની મરણાધીનતા અને માંદલાપણું સતત વધી રહ્યું છે, જે નિશ્ચિત જ યોગ્ય પગલાંથી નિવારી શકાય છે.

Diphtheria, whopping cough cases on the rise

Doctors attribute the incidence to inadequate and improper vaccination

HYDERABAD: Inadequate vaccination and immunity is driving incidence of diphtheria and whopping cough in the city, warn physicians.

Medics at the Fever Hospital speak of a steady flow of patients, children and adults, with diphtheria. While many show a case of severe infection with the classical white patch in the throat, others present with milder symptoms. Physicians attributed the incidence to inadequate and improper vaccination.

"Besides vaccines in childhood, a booster dose every 10 years is required in areas where diphtheria is endemic. That apart, those infected are often unvaccinated against the disease," said the hospital's superintendent Dr. K. Shankar. He added that patients visiting the hospital for treatment comprise local residents and migrants.

Lack of awareness

A study conducted in Hyderabad, which was published last month in *The Pediatric Infectious Disease Journal*, found that lack of awareness

about the disease and disbelief in vaccination was driving incidence. Diphtheria is a bacterial infection of the upper respiratory system that causes a few thousand deaths every year across the world.

Nearly three-quarters of the infections are said to occur in India though DTP vaccines are part of India's universal vaccination programme. A booster dose every decade is recommended in areas with high incidence. Speaking about the incidence of pertussis or whopping cough, Dr. Arif Ahmed, a city-based paediatric allergist, attributed improper vaccination to occurrence of vaccine-preventable diseases. "While not vaccinating is the main reason for incidence of whopping cough, sometimes improper vaccination also renders an individual vulnerable. The use of painless vaccines for whopping cough has also been found to be less efficient," he said.

The Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) has partnered with the non-for-profit Immunize India Charity, which rolled out an SMS-based reminder project in 2014 that will alert parents when due dates for vaccines are around. Around 90,000 children in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana are enrolled with the programme.

Most parents don't maintain vaccination calendar

Most parents in the country still do not maintain a vaccination immunisation calendar, and miss out on vaccine doses for their children, said doctors associated with the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) on Thursday.

Speaking to mediapersons, Dr Pramod Jog, president of IAP, said that every year, vaccine preventable diseases account for over 1.5 million deaths and about 1 million disabilities in children under 5 years of age in India. "In India, the percentage of children between 12–23 months of age who received all recommended vaccines on time is just 51.6% as parents do not maintain a vaccination calendar and often forget to vaccinate the child on time in a disciplined manner. This default is observed in both urban and rural areas," said Dr Jog.

Doctors emphasised that it is important to administer vaccinations for the top life-threatening vaccine preventable diseases in India such as pneumonia, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, rotavirus, polio, tuberculosis, measles and hepatitis B.



It was close this immunisation gap that Immunize India Charity launched a vaccine reminder program in association with IAP in 2014.

IAP-Immunize India is a free-of-cost SMS based vaccination reminder service which is nationally available across all mobile networks in India. Since almost every adult in urban and rural areas have mobile phones, the SMS reminder service is the most cost-effective reminder that a vaccination is due.

Doctors at the conference said Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and Kalyan have recorded 1.12 lakh registrations.

Dr Jog said that many infants were missing out regular vaccinations and these lapses are responsible for increased rates of child morbidity and mortality in India which can definitely be avoided.



Unlike the oral polio vaccine that the civic body gave for free to private practitioners, the injectable polio vaccine, introduced by the BMC on Tuesday, will be available only in public healthcare facilities. There is no stock of the vaccine in the market for doctors in private practice to buy. Both the BMC and paediatricians are asking parents to take their children to public units for their shot.

The BMC started administering the injectable vaccine on Tuesday. The vaccine, which now figures in the immunisation calendar, has to be administered to children at the age of six weeks and then 14 weeks, along with the oral polio vaccine.

Paediatricians say they do not wish to confuse parents and hence giving out uniform advice: take your child to a civic-run facility for the injectable vaccine. Dr Uday Pai, consultant paediatrician and past president of the Indian Academy of Paediatrics, said, "We have told all our members to refer children to municipal centres for the vaccine dose. We have also sent a letter to the BMC that if private patients do come, they too should be given the vaccine."

Doctors said parents should not panic, nor get confused. "If a child misses a shot, a catch up shot can be given later. This is not an emergency vaccine," said Dr Pai.

Civic officials said they have adequate supply of the vaccine. Dr Padmaja Keskar, BMC's executive health officer, said: "All private doctors can send us children for the injectable vaccine. We will be giving it for free."

Taking stock

Six months before the BMC launched the injectable vaccine, the government had procured all the stock available with various vaccine dealerships. Paediatricians, who were giving the injectable vaccine earlier, said they have not given a single shot since January as there were no vaccines available in the market.

"Until last August or September, a monthly stock of 15,000 to 20,000 doses of the injectable vaccine was enough for Mumbai," said vaccine dealer Dr Hareesh Shah. "But awareness shot up after the government started advertising on television that it would start administering injectable polio vaccine from April, 2016. So the demand shot up after that." Dr Shah, adding that there has been no stock for the last three months.

The shortage of the injectable polio vaccine is a global phenomenon. That is why it is being administered as an intradermal injection — between the layers of the skin — and not as an intramuscular injection, which uses up a larger quantity. The intramuscular shot needs just one dose, while the intradermal injection is given twice.

Both doctors and government officials are hopeful that production of the vaccine will scale up in the months to come.

100% protection from polio

Officials of the public health department have said that "simultaneous immunisation by oral polio vaccine and injectable polio vaccine will give dual protection to children and the community" and that "it will prevent reinfection and reactivation of polio disease". Doctors too said that the two doses of the injectable polio will be 100 per cent protection from the virus.

"To eradicate polio completely, extra doses of oral polio vaccine are to be administered to children under five during every pulse polio campaign in addition to the oral and injectable polio vaccine doses," the BMC stated in a press release following the injectable vaccine's launch.

The IAP has free vaccination reminder service that will cover a child from birth till 12 years of age. To avail the service, parents have to first register themselves with a IAP database by sending an SMS to 566778 conveying the baby's name and date of birth. They will receive an immediate confirmation and text messages for 12 years. There will be three reminders at two day intervals for each vaccination due.

Now, SMS alerts to remind parents to vaccinate kids

With a view to achieving full immunization across the country, the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) has launched SMS alerts to remind parents to vaccinate their children on particular dates. Designed at the national level, SMS alerts will be sent for free without any registration charges.

Messages will be sent to parents till their children reach 12 years. To avail the service, parents have to first register themselves with IAP database by sending an SMS to 566778, conveying the baby's name and date of birth. They will receive an immediate confirmation text message. Three reminders will be sent on the registered number two days before the due date of vaccination. To commemorate World Immunization Week (April 24-30), IAP organized a programme titled "Close the Immunization Gap" in Mumbai on Thursday. Prompted by distressed parents' dilemma of delayed or missed immunisation for their children, the Immunize India Charity conceived the vaccine reminder programme and partnered with IAP to launch 'IAP Immunize India' in March 2014.

IAP Immunize India is a free SMS-based vaccination reminder service which is nationally available across all mobile networks in India. The Maharashtra Telecom Circle (including Pune and Goa but excluding Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and Kalyan) recorded 1,18,301 registrations at IAP Immunize India.

Dr Ranjan Kumar Pejaver, Founder and Principal Trustee, Immunize India Charity, said, "As of March 31, 2016, the IAP Immunize India has received more than a million registrations (10,06,000) across India which has contributed greatly to increased compliance."

"An additional 3,00,000 vaccinations are happening which would have normally been missed," Pejaver said, adding that, now, the University of Kentucky, USA has approached them to implement a pilot programme on this issue.

Dr. Uday Pai, Past IAP Mumbai President and Consultant Pediatrician, AANGAN, Chembur, Mumbai said, "Immunization is one of the most successful and cost effective means to help children grow into healthy adults. No child should be denied the right to immunization for unfair reasons, including economic or social causes. In Mumbai, IAP Immunize India has increased immunization coverage and reduced vaccine preventable deaths among children below 5 years. The city (Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and Kalyan) recorded 1,12,000 registrations which means that an estimated 35,000 additional vaccinations are happening that would have otherwise been missed."



WHY IPV

- Provides serum immunity against all 3 types of poliovirus, and protects against paralytic poliomyelitis
- Given to infants at 6 weeks and then at 14 weeks in addition to OPV
- Available free of cost at all municipal and state-run hospitals and healthcare centres
- OPV is still the main preventive measure against polio

For your baby's injectable polio vaccine, you must go to BMC health centres

Unlike the oral polio vaccine that the civic body gave for free to private practitioners, the injectable polio vaccine, introduced by the BMC on Tuesday, will be available only in public healthcare facilities. There is no stock of the vaccine in the market for doctors in private practice to buy. Both the BMC and paediatricians are asking parents to take their children to public units for their shot.

The BMC started administering the injectable vaccine on Tuesday. The vaccine, which now figures in the immunisation calendar, has to be administered to children at the age of six weeks and then 14 weeks, along with the oral polio vaccine.

Paediatricians say they do not wish to confuse parents and hence giving out uniform advice: take your child to a civic-run facility for the injectable vaccine. Dr Uday Pai, consultant paediatrician and past president of the Indian Academy of Paediatrics, said, "We have told all our members to refer children to municipal centres for the vaccine dose. We have also sent a letter to the BMC that if private patients do come, they too should be given the vaccine."

Doctors said parents should not panic, nor get confused. "If a child misses a shot, a catch up shot can be given later. This is not an emergency vaccine," said Dr Pai. Civic officials said they have adequate supply of the vaccine. Dr Padmaja Keskar, BMC's executive health officer, said: "All private doctors can send us children for the injectable vaccine. We will be giving it for free."

Taking stock

Six months before the BMC launched the injectable vaccine, the government had procured all the stock available with various vaccine dealerships. Paediatricians, who were giving the injectable vaccine earlier, said they have not given a single shot since January as there were no vaccines available in the market.

“Until last August or September, a monthly stock of 15,000 to 20,000 doses of the injectable vaccine was enough for Mumbai,” said vaccine dealer Dr Haresh Shah. “But awareness shot up after the government started advertising on television that it would start administering injectable polio vaccine from April, 2016. So the demand shot up after that.” Dr Shah, adding that there has been no stock for the last three months.

The shortage of the injectable polio vaccine is a global phenomenon. That is why it is being administered as an intradermal injection — between the layers of the skin — and not as an intramuscular injection, which uses up a larger quantity. The intramuscular shot needs just one dose, while the intradermal injection is given twice.

Both doctors and government officials are hopeful that production of the vaccine will scale up in the months to come.

100% protection from polio

Officials of the public health department have said that “simultaneous immunisation by oral polio vaccine and injectable polio vaccine will give dual protection to children and the community” and that “it will prevent reinfection and reactivation of polio disease”. Doctors too said that the two doses of the injectable polio will be 100 per cent protection from the virus.

“To eradicate polio completely, extra doses of oral polio vaccine are to be administered to children under five during every pulse polio campaign in addition to the oral and injectable polio vaccine doses,” the BMC stated in a press release following the injectable vaccine’s launch.

Now, SMS alerts to remind parents to vaccinate kids

With a view to achieving full immunisation across the country, the Indian Academy of Paediatrics (IAP) has launched SMS alerts to remind parents to vaccinate their children on particular dates. Designed at the national level, SMS alerts will be sent for free without any registration charges.

Messages will be sent to parents till their children reach 12 years. To avail the service, parents have to first register themselves with IAP database by sending an SMS to 566778, conveying the baby's name and date of birth. They will receive an immediate confirmation text message. Three reminders will be sent on the registered number two days before the due date of vaccination. To commemorate World Immunisation Week (April 24-30), IAP organised a programme titled "Close the Immunisation Gap" in Mumbai on Thursday. Speaking at the programme, medical experts said that only 51.6 per cent of Indian children below two years of age receive timely recommended vaccinations across the country. Further, over 1.5 million deaths are recorded annually, which can be stopped through proper vaccination.
